- ➤ Bought by Linden Homes in 1998
















Masterplan sets out Urban Village



Set up in December 1999 The Vision to be delivered - Key Elements

- ➤ Mixed sustainable development
- ≥400 originally 350 (89 affordable) distributed through site
- ≥1000 jobs from supermarket, doctors, businesses, care home...
- ➤ Enterprise Centre The Officers' Mess purchased at discount
- ➤ The Naafi 96 place nursery, offices & business space
- ➤ Supermarket....larger, rather than convenience store
- Facilities for sports, arts, learning, young people (Cricket & Football pitches, arts centre, skatepark)

Work completed in 11 years

- Naafi building (11,000 sq ft) redesigned, refurbished and let
- ➤ Football has run for 12 years 21 teams has replaced clubhouse and is applying for charter standard
- Pavilion completed No cricket club at present but used by Scouts, Cubs
 & Beavers, CR3 Youth Group and Richmond Fellowship
- Arts Centre designed and first phase (kids play space +) built
 & closed & re-opened under new management (Shareholding IPS)
- Officers' Mess purchased for Enterprise Hub completed currently 52% let
- Skatepark developed in Gyms now (temporarily) in Grade 2 listed Chapel
